2.1 Tasks that may be performed during the contest

- **Workshop Procedures**
 - Service Information Retrieval
 - Electronic system use
 - Traditional manual/information printouts use.
 - Interprets work order information to convey diagnostic approach⁸.
 - Explanation of service work performed.

- **Engine Mechanical**
 - Assembly / disassembly
 - Identify components
 - Component fault diagnosis
 - Inspection and testing
 - Diagnosis and service of cylinder heads and blocks
 - Measurements with dial-indicator, plastigage, micrometers, feeler gauges, and straight edge

- **Engine Ignition, Management and Emissions**
 - Identify components
 - Drivability diagnostics and repair
 - Test equipment usage
 - Scan Tool
 - Multi-meter (DVOM)
 - Lab-scope
 - System repair
 - Component operation and testing

- **Electrical Systems**
 - Starting systems
 - Charging systems
 - Batteries
 - Accessories
 - Testing and diagnosis
 - Body and Chassis Electrical

- **Braking Systems (excluding air brake systems)**
 - Identify components
 - Inspection and testing
 - Assembly / disassembly

Dark colored denim, blue or black work pants or dark coveralls will be considered acceptable pants

Collared cotton work shirts are preferred, but T-shirts will be allowed (no offensive slogans)

Absolutely NO hoodies permitted. Absolutely NO tank tops or muscle shirts

All clothing will be clean respectable and untorn

Any hats worn will be respectable and clean

NO hand or wrist jewellery permitted while competing

6. SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

6.1 List of required personal protective equipment (PPE) provided by competitors

Safety glasses, CSA work boots. (Provided by competitor)

Regular prescription eyewear is not acceptable for use as safety eyewear
