1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose of the Challenge.

The principal role of an Aesthetician is to perform services to enhance client physical and psychological well-being through manicures, makeup (evening look) and body therapy (back treatment with reflexology to the feet).

The challenge evaluates each competitor's readiness for employment and recognizes outstanding students for their excellence and professionalism in the aesthetic industry.

1.3 Skills and Knowledge to be tested.

Manicure with French gel application with arm and hand massage

Objective:

- Analyze hands and fingernails
- Record observations on technical chart
- Perform a dry manicure, nail shaping and cuticle work
- Gel base coat
- French tip application
- All 10 fingers will have a French nail application, smile line will reflect the nail shape of the client
- Smile line can be corrected before curing
- Gel topcoat
- Perform a hand and forearm massage showing various massage movements for 5 minutes total for both hand/arms
- Clean and tidy workstation

Evening Makeup Look with Strip Lashes

Objective:

- The competition will do an evening makeup look to the face adding strip lashes to complete the look
- Models will have time after judging is completed to remove makeup for the next part of the competition

Back Treatment with Foot Reflexology to both feet

Objective:

- The competitor will fill out a detailed consultation
- The competitor will perform a back treatment on the entire back area
- The competitor will perform foot reflexology to both feet

2. SKILLS FOR SUCCESS

4. ASSESSMENT

4.1 Point Breakdown

In the event of a tie in scoring, the following procedure will apply:

- The competitor with the highest score in the Back treatment with foot reflexology will be declared the winner.
- If there is still a tie, the competitor with the highest score in the Manicure with hand and arm massage will be declared the winner.
